As the voice for our wild public lands, waters, and wildlife, BHA is dedicated to restoration and conservation efforts that conserve vital ecosystem functions and expand public access for hunting and fishing.

California boasts some of the most ecologically and recreationally significant freshwater fisheries in the country. Salmon and steelhead trout bearing surface waters are of vital importance to California's broader ecological health, serve as an essential freshwater resource for much of the state, and provide recreational opportunities that are integral to the culture of a wide swath of Californian's, including many Indigenous Tribes.
