STATEMENT OF FAITH

We welcome dialogue on many issues related to Christian doctrine and encourage all to reason and think critically on these things. However, we recognize the importance of having a framework around which we grow in maturity and relate to one another as a community of believers, and we hold the following essentials to be at the core of who we are and what we believe:

ABOUT GOD

We believe that there is one God, eternally present in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

(Genesis 1:26; Matthew 3:16-17; John 1:1-4)

ABOUT JESUS

Jesus is the eternal Son of God. He was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, worked miracles and gave us an example to follow. Fully God and fully man, He died on a cross to pay the penalty for sin that separated us from God and rose from the dead to reconcile us to our Creator and to free us to have a new life in Him. Now, He sits at the right hand of the Father to intercede for us. (Matthew 1:22-23, John 1:1-5; 14:10-30, Acts 1:9-11, Hebrews 4:14-15)

ABOUT THE HOLY SPIRIT

We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells all believers, and through the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, believers are empowered for Christian service and gifted for this service. The Holy Spirit also enables believers to live a Christ-like life exhibiting Godly character.

(Luke 11:13; Acts 1:8; 2:1-4; 8:17; 10:44-46; 19:6; Galatians 5:22-23; I Corinthians 12)

ABOUT THE BIBLE

We believe the Holy Bible to be the inspired, infallible, and authoritative source of Christian faith and practice. As our supreme revelation from God, it is superior to conscience and reason, though not contrary to reason.

(2 Timothy 3:16- 17)

ABOUT SALVATION

We believe that in order to be born again, one must respond to the Holy Spirit's conviction by repenting of and turning away from sin, by faith receiving the sacrificial death of Jesus Christ on the cross as being a sufficient basis for God's forgiveness and must surrender his or her life to Christ.

LEADERSHIP FRAMEWORK

We want to build competencies across the board for every leader in our church.



LEADING SELF

Teachable: We are life-long learners. We serve in humility and are open to developing our skills and character.

Team Player: Being ready, willing, and able to support the team no matter what. The best team players are the ones who act unselfishly and make decisions for the good of the team.

Gets It Done: Your words and actions line up. You show up when scheduled and confirmed. You finish what you start. We can count on you.

Problem Solver: We resolve issues we face. We don't leave things unresolved or complain. Problems are opportunities we commit to finding solutions for.

Adds Value: Growing in how to use your God-given gifts and strengths to build up the team.

LEADERSHIP FRAMEWORK

LEADING OTHERS

Self-aware: Knowing how your personality, habits, and skills impact those around you. Learning to see, enjoy, and leverage the strengths and gifts of others.

Team Builder: Effective and healthy leaders build trust and loyalty amongst their team rather than leading from a position of fear or power. We start by serving one another.

Pursues Excellence: A decision or commitment to a high quality performance that produces great results of lasting value.

Dot Connector: A person who can connect the church's vision to their specific ministry area and begin to see how it fits within the big picture.

Great Communicator: Clearly and consistently delivers needed information. Also embodies good listening and non-verbal skills to ensure understanding.

LEADING LEADERS

Spiritual Leader: A spiritual leader spends time with God and knows how to be led by the Holy Spirit. They naturally move people to a deeper personal relationship with Jesus.

Coach/Mentor: A guide and advice-giver who supports each team member and maximizes their strenghths for a greater impact.

Goal Setter: Determines ways to measure what matters in support of a strategy.

Strategic: A person who isn't waiting to be told what to do. They approach what's needed today with a much larger, long-term goal. Fundamentally, a forward thinker.

Inspiring: Captivate and move people through inspiration and story. Creates connections with ease that are real, emotional, and personal. People understand you and act differently as a result of your words.

LEADERSHIP FRAMEWORK

IMPLEMENTATION AND CONTINUED TRAINING:

Ministry Area: Leadership Development will take place in your serve area.

- Ongoing coaching and feedback in your ministry.
- 1:1s: Regularly scheduled times for the leader to check-in with their teams members.

Team Nights: During our monthly team nights, leaders will receive ongoing leadership and discipleship training.

Behind The Scenes Tour: Every 2nd & 4th Sunday of the month at 9:15a. This is the first step to becoming a part of Team Orange.

Team Member Training: Every 3rd Sunday of the month at 9:30a, we train and introduce our team member agreement, serve standards, and leadership framework to set each team member up for success.

Team Lead Onboarding: Every 2nd & 3rd Sunday of the month at 9:30a, we will train how to lead effectively in Community Church.

LEADERSHIP LAYERS

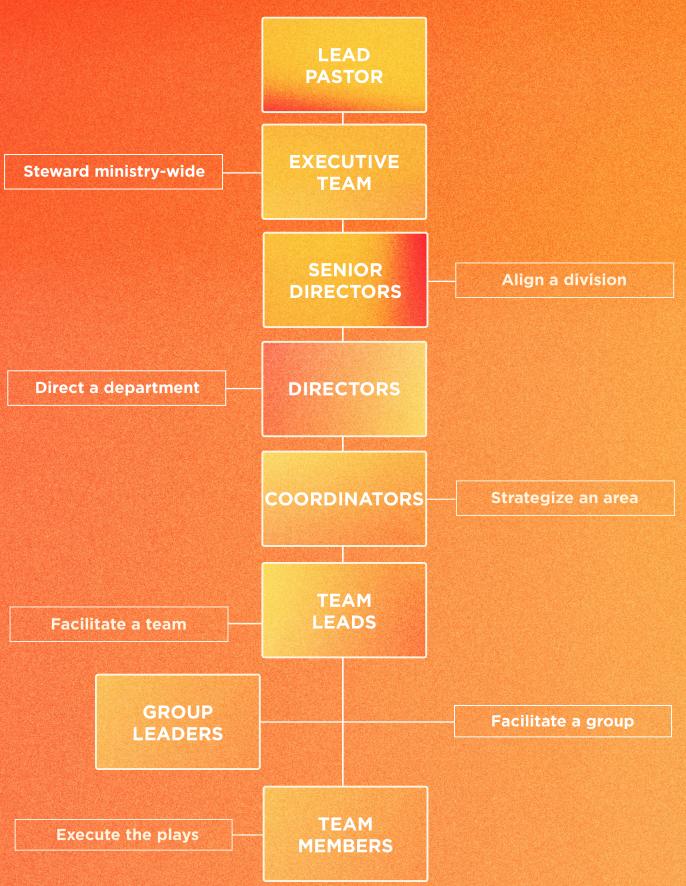

All leaders have the awesome responsibility and opportunity to build meaningful relationships that foster continued spiritual growth!

LEADERSHIP LAYERS

The way we lead



LEADERSHIP AGREEMENT

- I will remain connected to Christ and His church through regular prayer, Bible reading, and courageously responding to the Holy Spirit's prompting.
- I will choose wisdom, self-control, and a disciplined life in every area.
- I will put God first in my finances, practice tithing 10% of what God has entrusted to me, and combat greed by prioritizing consistent giving and generosity.
- I will use my influence, speech, and social media to uplift and edify those around me, being kind and compassionate.
- I will protect the unity of Community Church by appropriately supporting church leadership and avoiding gossip or complaining.
- I will strive to love people the same way God loves us in all I do .
- I will make the necessary behavioral shifts from being an individual contributor in God's house to recruiting, training, and building up others to get things done.
- I will commit to building meaningful relationships and having necessary conversations that foster continuous development for those I lead.
- I will submit to all necessary screening, guidelines, training, specific responsibilities, ongoing development, and accountability associated with my Team O leadership position.

RESPONSIBILITIES COORDINATOR

Main Focus: Strategizes & plans for a ministry area Estimated Time Commitment: 8-12 hours per week

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

During The Week:

- Meet with direct report for care and coaching; report area strategy and data to inform direction.
- Meet with team leads to provide coaching, care, and resourcing; receiving area data to inform strategy and plans.
- Schedule Team Leads for Sunday services.
- Communicate with other team members for collaborative planning.
- Attend all leadership focused meetings as requested.
- Plan for meetings, huddles, training sessions, and other area needs.
- Recruiting and overseeing on-boarding process for teams.
- Oversee the development process for the teams.

On the Weekend:

- Check-in at Team Orange Central.
- Attend necessary huddles (lead occasionally).
- Oversee area teams and related church-wide events.
- Evaluate team leads, Team Members and the ministry area.
- Encourage and appreciate area Team Leads and team members.
- Intentionally engage newcomers (or people new to you).

What about absences?

- Should a Coordinator need to miss a Sunday, the expectation is to communicate the absence well in advance to their direct report.
- When Coordinators are absent, a plan should be established with their Team Leads to ensure all area needs are met.
- All Coordinators are expected to serve at assigned services for Christmas and Easter.

RESPONSIBILITIES TEAM LEAD

Main Focus: Facilitates a ministry team

Estimated Time Commitment: 5-10 hours per week

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

During The Week:

- Meet with direct report for care and coaching; report ministry team data to inform strategy.
- Meet with team members to provide coaching, care, and resourcing; receiving feedback from team members to inform best practices.
- Create schedules for Team Members.
- Compile data for the service/Sunday you lead and submit data to Coordinator.
- Recruit, onboard, and train new Team Members.
- Communicate with other Team Members for collaborative planning.
- Attend all leadership focused meetings as requested.
- Plan for meetings, huddles, training sessions, and other ministry team needs.
- Oversee the development process for the ministry team.

On the Weekend:

- Check-in at Team Orange Central.
- Attend/Lead team huddles.
- Train & delegate responsibilities & oversee team.
- Complete Sunday Summary for your ministry area within 24 hours of Sunday services.
- Encourage and appreciate Team Members.
- Intentionally engage newcomers (or people new to you).

What about absences?

- Should a Team Lead need to miss a Sunday, the expectation is to communicate the absence well in advance to direct report.
- When a Team Lead is absent, a plan is established with their Team Members to ensure all area needs are met
- All Team Leads are expected to serve at assigned services for Christmas and Easter.

RESPONSIBILITIES GROUP/HANGOUT LEADER

Main Focus: Facilitates groups within a semester Estimated Time Commitment: 5-10 hours per week

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

During The Semester:

- Lead members of your group/hangout.
- Identify potential leaders using our leadership framework.
- Meet with your direct report 1 on 1 for care and coaching.
- Ensure your group meets at minimum two times per month during semester.
 - Hangouts meet less frequently, but should be consistent.
- Take attendance when your group meets and record it in GroupVitals.
- Manage your group within GroupVitals, including keeping it up-to-date and responding to potential group members within 48 hours of indicated group interest.
- Set the stage for your group/hangout by providing a welcoming atmosphere, being inclusive, and communicating with your members in advance.
- Keep healthy conversations flowing your group/hangout while encouraging everyone to participate.
- Be intentional in your preparation for each group/hangout meeting.
- Connect with your group members outside of the group via phone, email, or in person.
- Uphold the Community Church Leadership Agreement.
- Promote your group within Community Church.
- Invite new people to try or join your group consistently.

A win for a Group/HangOut

- You win when your group members strengthen their relationship with God and seek continued growth.
 - Encourage group members to consider our life classes.
- You win when you group members find deep connectedness with each other.

LEADERSHIP ONBOARDING PROCESS

/// TEAM MEMBER → TEAM LEAD

- 1. Coordinator discovers and meets with potential Team Lead and if interested fills out leadership application.
 - a. Use the leadership framework to recognize leadership potential.
- 2. Upon completion of the application, the potential leader signs up for Team Lead Training.
- 3. Potential Team Lead attend both training sessions.
 - a. 2nd & 3rd Sunday of each month at 9:30a.
- 4. Once Training is complete, Team Lead will sign the Leadership Agreement and be ready for training in their area.
- 5. Training in their area should include:
 - a. Initial meeting about area expectations and what is included in the role.
 - **b.** Shadowing by Coordinator.
 - c. Regular 1:1 meetings with coordinator (weekly or bi-weekly).

/// TEAM LEAD - COORDINATOR

- 1. Director discovers potential Coordinator for the role based on Leadership Framework.
- 2. Director meets and goes over expectations for the role.
- 3. If the person expresses interest in the position, then the Director will conduct a panel interview process with the team.
 - a. Panel Interview must include a director, a coordinator and someone from their team (Team Lead or Team Member).
- 4. After the panel interview, they must complete the following before starting in their role:
 - a. Review Leader Agreement with Director.
 - b. Review the playbook.
